HELP FROM CITIZENS ADVICE

Q. I've had my Universal Credit payments reduced for missing an appointment. I don't think this is fair as I had a good reason for not being able to attend. Now I am struggling to make ends meet. What should I do?

A. If you think the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) has made a mistake, you can ask for the decision to be reconsidered. Contact them as soon as possible setting out why you disagree, including the date of the decision and your personal information and National Insurance number. You can do this in your Universal Credit online account, or a form on the government website, in writing or over the phone. If the DWP does not change its decision you can appeal. This could involve going to a tribunal and may take some time. Meanwhile, ask the DWP for a hardship payment through the Universal Credit helpline, or at your local Jobcentre Plus office. This is usually a loan and will be deducted from future Universal Credit payments. You may also be able to apply for financial help from your local council. Your local Citizens Advice can help you with all this.

EXCITING NEWS FROM THE RVHS

Many readers will remember that when the late Mr Joe
Jackson's estate was sold in 2010, a concerted local
effort resulted in the Rusland Valley Horticultural
Society (RVHS) and the Rusland Valley Community
Trust (RVCT) purchasing the show field and adjacent
land. Legal arrangements were made such the RVHS
would be able to become the sole owner once it was in
a financial position to do so.

We are pleased to report that at its AGM in November,
and with sufficient money becoming available
(including a donation from the late Mr Bobbie Dobson),
the RVHS committee voted unanimously to proceed
with the purchase of the RVCT's share. The Society is
now in the enviable position of owning its own show
field, and its own marquees.

This helps to ensure the long-term survival of the
Rusland Show. However, as always, there is a catch.
Both the show itself, and the hiring out of the
marquees, also require a good deal of voluntary effort.
Following years of hard work, for which we are all very
grateful, our Secretary, Antony Meanwell, and our
Treasurer, Duncan Clegg, have retired from the
committee. The current Acting Secretary, Maureen
Boyren, is seeking someone to work with her, with a
view to taking over in due course.

In addition, Tom Watson who has for so long managed
the marquees and their hire, is looking for someone to
work with him to learn the ropes(!) because he will be
retiring in the next 12 months. This is an important role
as it is the marquee hire that underpins the financial
sustainability of the show.

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends,
At the time of writing this reflection, the debate and vote in Parliament on 'Brexit' is to come. As you read 'The Link' what will be the future state of the European Union, the United Kingdom? Can politicians be united in a vision for our nation affecting generations to come? What does the future hold? 'Unity' is deeply sought, seen as bringing peace and security. It is often, however, a manipulated word used to hide behind national, political, local and personal interests and agendas. What type of unity do we want... yours or mine?
And what of unity in the world Church, when it is so often accused of dividing peoples and nations? In January the Church locally and across the world celebrated Unity week, but what does this really mean in a clearly divided Church? Writing from a historic free church perspective of the Baptist Chapel we claim our forebears as the original separatists from state control of conscience and religious belief. Far from unifying, we were classed as dividers, and paid the price, as did many others, in their search for freedom. Thankfully the Church today can aim for deeper unity. We seek in all our ways to work with and for others, whilst maintaining our unique character.
What might unity look like?
I recall as a child playing with a kaleidoscope, a long cardboard tube with multi coloured pieces of glass in the end which, when held up to the light and turned, created patterns which reshaped with each turn. Maybe a form of kaleidoscopic freedom is what all seek. It only works, however, as it is held to the light and turned slowly and carefully.
For the Christian, Jesus, and not a divided Church, is the light who enlightens everyone. He can shine through all our mixed motives, agendas and 'unions', if we allow him to turn us around in his hands and produce patterns which can delight all.
