 On Monday 13th May we had our Annual Parish Meeting and our Annual General Meeting. The main part of the Parish Meeting was the Annual Report from our Chair available at www.coltonparishcouncil.org.uk. This was followed by our Annual General meeting, summarised below:
Governance: Cllr Dean was re-elected as Chair and Cllr D Hoyle as Vice-Chair. Thanks to them both for all their hard work in respect of the Parish.
District Council update: Cllr A Hall sent an email update on activities at South Lakeland District Council including; the Council's Strategy for Parks and Open Spaces, Morecambe Bay Health Trust, Governance Review and Wild Camping. County Council update: Cllr M Breton gave an update on County Council issues, particularly Highways and he has agreed to send a joint letter with the Parish Council regarding the condition and the problematic over-use of the road that runs from the Tottlebank Junction and acts as a short cut from the A595 to the A590. Mobile signal update: David Hoyle had contacted Tim Farron MP over the EE mast at Hulleter Farm. He has had a response which indicates that EE intend the mast to be switched on for commercial use by late June. The Clerk and other members of the public had contacted Vodafone regarding the Crake Valley signal and have received confirmation this had been restored.
Bouth Playground update: David Harmer gave an update on the Annual Playground ROSPA inspection and repair work that was required. It was agreed that the repairs in the region of £600 should be undertaken. It was also agreed that a grant application would be made to Big Lottery and various charities for the funds of around £10,000 to improve the playground surface.

CHURCH NEWS

*Dear Friends,
 The thing about prejudice is that sometimes there is just a tiny sliver of truth in it, otherwise it wouldn't be so infuriating. If there is no truth in it, you can just dismiss it as stupid. But prejudice can take a tiny insight and make it into a colossal (and usually mean-spirited) generalization that obscures the complexity, texture and goodness of its object. Lots of people have some sort of prejudice against Christianity, perhaps as part of a wider prejudice against religion generally. And while it would be nice to say that there is no truth in those prejudices, it is impossible to do so. Sometimes it seems to me that there is more than just a sliver of truth in them- there are great chunks of the stuff. Christians have often propounded an impoverished faith, and have even more frequently failed to live up to the faith professed. Christians have said and done stupid and hateful things in the name of their religion, and continue to do so. And yet, I remain convinced of Christianity's continued relevance today. I even remain convinced of the continued relevance of the church, as a place to discover who we really are and who we really could be. There is so much distrust in the world, so much hatred and violence and cruelty, and most of all so much fear. What the world needs more than anything else is communities of trust and support and love that show us what kind of life is possible. I believe the church should be made up of communities such as these, and remind us of the ultimate depth of existence. Which is good, because we've been given thousands of them across the country and millions all round the world.*

HELP FROM CITIZENS ADVICE

Q. I'm having problems with a builder I employed to build a kitchen extension to our house. The back of our house is now a tarpaulin sheet. We have paid quite a lot, and he keeps asking for more. We had a bit of a row, and he hasn't turned up for the last two days. What should I do next?
 A. If you want the builder to carry on, try to agree a detailed written schedule of works and payments. If you pay any future instalments by credit card rather than cash you'll also have protection from the card provider. Take photos as the work progresses and keep copies of everything.
 If you feel the situation with that trader can't continue, complain in writing and ask for a proportional refund. If you believe the work is substandard you can report problems to Trading Standards via the Citizens Advice consumer service.
 If that doesn't work, look for an approved alternative dispute resolution (ADR) scheme - this is an independent third party who can help you to reach a compromise. Call the Citizens Advice consumer service (0345 04 05 06) for further help.
