CITIZENS ADVICE BUREAU

I'm looking online for fancy dress costumes for my kids. But I'm worried as I've read stories about some costumes not being fire-safe and some children being hurt. What should I look for to keep them safe?

Unfortunately, you're right. There have been a number of incidents where children's costumes were set alight by accident. Check that the costume comes with safety instructions, a CE marking and the manufacturer's name. A CE marking means the product complies with health and safety requirements, and the product has been tested for flammability. (Sometimes a fake CE mark is used. A giveaway is the middle line of 'E', which should be shorter than the other parts.)

Make sure you're buying from a reputable online retailer. Find out as much about them as you can, like customer reviews, or ask them directly for safety information. Also check whether the product has ever been recalled before, on the website **productrecall.campaign.gov.uk**.

Talk to your children about how best to stay safe while having fun in fancy dress, like keeping away from candles and open flames. And if you're in doubt, don't buy the product. You can always contact Citizens Advice consumer helpline on 03454 04 05 06 for further help or to report an issue.

Councillor vacancies

Our full complement of councillors is nine and for a considerable amount of time we have operating with only six councillors. Following interest expressed by two individuals, at our October meeting we were pleased to co-opt as councillors Abigail Bennett from Spark Bridge and Prof. John Taylor from Finsthwaite. This leaves just one vacancy and notices have been posted advertising the vacancy for any individuals who may be interested to contact our clerk at clerk@coltonparishcouncil.org.uk

Planning

As councillors we receive numerous issues raised by parishioners re planning some of which we can answer immediately and others we refer to the National Park Planning for a resolution. The planners ask the Parish Council to be the eyes and ears re possible planning issues but we have become concerned that, despite raising these issues, we have had little feedback and often this takes up to twelve months. Due to these concerns we arranged a meeting with three members of the planning department to attempt to address the situation and see if we could improve communication. The meeting was constructive and both the council and planners have a better understanding of the process and concerns. Individual outstanding issues were discussed which hopefully will be resolved, but only time will tell.

Community Grants

The council has allocated an amount of money to support community organisations which could make use of additional funds to provide new or replacement items, or towards minor repairs, or it could help a community group buy equipment. Notices have been posted and whilst the deadline for applications was the **Friday 22 November** we will still accept applications after this date.
