COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Thank you to everyone who contacted us with their recent experiences of coping during the snowstorm before Christmas and the recent high winds. We used your contributions to help us highlight our concerns about the number of power outages affecting our local communities, in particular, Bouth and Colton, when we, along with other local Parish Councils, met with **Electricity North West (ENWL) on** 12th February.

The meeting was convened by ENWL following a letter we wrote to their Chief Executive asking for explanations for the lack of resilience in the network and voicing our concerns about the impact on residents, particularly older people, young families, and people with long term health conditions.

Lots of issues were raised including: improving the resilience of the local network and communications infrastructure; the importance of local resilience hubs: how vulnerable members of the community can be more effectively supported in extreme weather events; and, the mechanisms for claiming and paying compensation. The plan is for a follow up meeting in the autumn to share progress and to look forward to the forthcoming winter. We will keep you updated.

The system used for identifying people who might need extra support during power cuts is the Priority Services Register. If you or someone you know has a long-term health condition, a disability, mobility issues, a baby or toddler to look after, or is elderly, then you or they may wish to sign up. It is free to register. You can either contact your own supplier or go to the ENWL website.

Grit bins can be applied for. Can people let us know if they need a grit bin, e.g. Dale Park, Church Lane, Kennels Road. We will then apply for the number of grit bins needed.

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends.

At the end of March, we will celebrate Easter. It is so early this year, that as I write this, it seems like we have barely got Christmas out of the way. But that reminds me just how connected these two Christian festivals are.

'What has Easter got to do with Christmas?' is a guestion that nobody is asking me, but I want to try to answer anyway.

Christmas is when we discover that God affirms creation so deeply that, despite everything, God thought it was worth entering our life, taking on our mantle, and inhabiting our existence. He cannot bear to be separated from us, so becomes one of us. This is what everything is for. God made the world in order to be with us. Christmas affirms the fleshly, tangible, earthiness of human existence. Matter matters. Stuff is so good that God wants to be stuff.

Easter affirms the same things, but goes a step further, A massive step further. The death of Jesus by crucifixion was humanity having one almighty allergic reaction to the goodness of God, to God being with us. We have always rebelled against God's love, but maybe never quite as much as this.

But the joy of Easter, of Christ's resurrection, is that we see that God will be with us in Christ, even when we have tried our hardest to prevent that from happening.

Easter shows us that nothing whatsoever can stop God being with us, not just at a particular moment in history - but forever. Love will have the last word.
